Public benefits



- Delivering this project will provide Penrith with a new social and entertainment hub that will support more families moving into new homes being rolled out by the NSW Government in Sydney's west.
- The project is expected to support around 500 jobs (to date, 700 people have been inducted) during construction and a further 650 jobs once operational. Wherever possible we'll be ensuring those jobs go to local contractors.
- The stadium will be universally accessible, safe, and inclusive for all users, attracting more visitors to the venue.
- The venue will bring new sporting events and concerts to Penrith while continuing to support the growth of rugby league, football and rugby union in western Sydney.
- The precinct will be accessible to the community all-year round with access to a landscaped forecourt, including basketball hoops and a playing field.
- The stadium is expected to be ready for operations in 2027.



Key features

The stadium was designed with community and key stakeholder input with visitor experience at front of mind:



- Ground capacity of around 25,000 and an additional 5,000 capacity in concert mode
- Steeper grandstands to maximise seating, with premium views to the field or stage
- More food and beverage outlets and amenities
- Increased wheelchair accessible seats three-fold and more wheelchair accessible toilets
- New scoreboards, sound system, ribbon boards and lighting
- Improved player sporting facilities for men and women
- New secure turnstiles to improve security and flow in and out of events
- Reconfigured warm-up field and community-accessible public spaces
- Creating a family-friendly atmosphere that preserves the north and south hills.



The grandstands

The **red outline** illustrates the gradient of the previous existing grandstands, while the **black outline** shows the new, steeper grandstands designed to maximise seating capacity and improve sightlines to the field or stage areas.



The **western grandstand** has corporate suites, media boxes and function rooms.



The lower tier of the **eastern grandstand** is designed for all-ability access, ensuring compliance with the Disability Discrimination Act (DDA).
